Sunday Propers: 3rd Sunday of the Great Fast; The Veneration of the Holy Cross

Troparion (7): By Your cross You destroyed death;* You opened Paradise to the thief;* You changed the lamentation of the myrrh-bearers to joy,* and charged the apostles to proclaim* that You are risen, O Christ our God,* offering great mercy to the world.

Troparion (1): Save Your people, O Lord, and bless Your inheritance.* Grant victory to Your faithful people against enemies,* and protect Your community by Your cross.

Kontakion (7): Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen. No longer does the flaming sword guard the gate of Eden;* the tree of the Cross has quenched its flames gloriously.* The sting of death and the victory of Hades are banished,* and You O my Saviour came and called to those in Hades: "Return again to Paradise!"

Instead of Holy God, we sing: To Your Cross, O Master,* we bow in veneration,* and we glorify Your holy Resurrection!

Prokeimenon (6): Save Your people, O Lord, and bless Your inheritance.

Verse: Unto You I will cry, O Lord my God, lest You turn from me in silence.

Epistle (Hebrews 4:14-5:6): Brothers and Sisters, since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honor, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but

The Veneration of the Holy Cross (The 3rd Sunday of Great and Holy Lent, March 3rd)

The Third Sunday of Lent is that of the Veneration of the Cross. The cross stands in the midst of the church in the middle of the lenten season not merely to remind men of Christ's redemption and to keep before them the goal of their efforts, but also to be venerated as that reality by which man must live to be saved. "He who does not take up his cross and follow me is not worthy of me" (Mt.10:38). For in the Cross of Christ Crucified lies both "the power of God and the wisdom of God" for those being saved (1 Cor.1:24).

Recurring crises in CHURCH - Nothing new?

The dogmas of the fathers are despised; apostolic traditions are set at nought; the discoveries of innovators hold sway in the churches. Men have learned to be speculatists instead of theologians. The wisdom of the world has the place of honor, having dispossessed the glory of the Cross. The pastors are driven away, grievous wolves are brought in instead, and plunder the flock of Christ. Houses of prayer are destitute of preachers; the deserts are full of mourners; the aged sorrow, comparing what is with what was; more pitiable the young, as not knowing what they are deprived of. - *St. Athanasius* (296-373).

God does not create a cross for man. No matter how heavy a cross a man may carry in life, it is still just wood, from which man himself made, and it always grows from the soil of his heart. *Ambrose of Optina* (+1891)

Excerpts from "The Son of the Church"

An Explanation of the Cross Which we Wear about the Shoulders on a Cord.

Take heed also concerning the Cross which thou we arest about thy shoulders. Remember the covenant which exists between thee and Christ Himself. When thou camest forth from the baptismal font, thou didst promise to be a servant of Christ and didst venerate His Crucifixion, the Cross of Christ, and wast signed with the Cross of Christ and didst receive from the priest's hand the Cross of Christ, which thou didst place upon thy shoulders. thou didst accept Christ's covenant, whereby thou didst promise to follow Christ according to the Gospel; as it is written: "He that taketh not His Cross and followeth after me, is not worthy of Me." Thou hast taken up the Cross and promised to follow after Christ. Be mindful then, that thou wearest upon thy body the image of the Cross of Christ, upon which He voluntarily suffered for our salvation. This is God's covenant; this is the ensign of Christ the King: this is the standard of the heavenly hosts; thereby wilt thou be known as a servant of Christ. If anyone ask thee, "What is that?", answer him thus, as it is written: "I bear on my body the marks of the Lord Jesus." If he say, "Where is it written, and who hath commanded thus?", tell him that the Lord carried the cross when the Lord went to His voluntary Passion. It was He Who charged us who believe in Him to carry the Cross. As the divine Luke saith, "They laid hold upon one Simon, a Cyrenian, coming out of the country, and on him they laid the Cross that he might bear it after Jesus." At that time, also, the wise thief by the cross entered into Paradise. But if the man reproach thee and make further inquiries, flee from him quickly, for he is not a believer. For when a man is overly inquisitive about things divine, he hath a deep heart, and God is exalted over him, but he descendeth down to hell, because he seeketh to know what is above him, and keepeth not that which hat been handed down to him. From an Old Prayer Book.

Far be it for me to glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Gal. 6:14).

Truly this symbol is thought despicable; but it is so in the world's reckoning, and among men; in Heaven and among the faithful it is the highest glory. Poverty too is despicable, but it is our boast; and to be cheaply thought of by the public is a matter of laughter to them, but we are elated by it. So too is the Cross our boast. He does not say, 'I boast not,' nor, 'I will not boast,' but, 'Far be it from me that I should,' as if he abominated it as absurd, and invoked the aid of God in order to his success therein. And what is the boast of the Cross? That Christ for my sake took on Him the form of a slave, and bore His sufferings for me the slave, the enemy, the unfeeling one; yea, He so loved me as to give Himself up to a curse for me. What can be comparable to this? *St. John Chrysostom, Homilies on Galatians*



3rd Sunday of the Great Fast

Sacrifice is not outmoded as long as Christianity means obedience to the mind and will of Christ. Jesus said to his disciples, "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." Jesus shattered all their illusions, for he went on to say, in effect, "I am not the kind of Messiah you have been expecting, not an earthly King of power and glory, but a meek, despised, suffering Servant who must walk the way of a Cross ... I am going to be crucified. Do you understand? I am going to die. That's how my work must be done and that's how it will have to be carried on. If you want to share in that work, if you want to have any fellowship with me and live within the circle of my friends and followers, then you must take my Cross, this principle of sacrificial love, and make it the central, controlling principle of your life."

Jesus often spoke to his disciples in those terms. He promised that they would be absurdly happy, but he promised them also a life of sacrifice. He never hid his scars to win or keep a disciple. The Apostle Paul saw the Cross in the same way. Writing to his friends at Philippi, he declared that his supreme ambition was to reproduce in his life the events of Christ's life-"that I may know him, and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable to his death." Paul sees the Cross as an event that goes on generation after generation in the life of the church and in the lives of those who obey Christ and continue his ministry.

Shall we say that the principle is now outmoded as a way of life for Christians? If so, we have to rewrite much of the New Testament and change many of the sayings of Jesus. As long as the Cross remains central in our faith, it calls us to a life of sacrifice.

Challenge

Sacrifice is not outmoded as long as the human heart responds to a challenge, as it does where ultimate issues are at stake. Do you think that the disciples would have responded if Jesus on his way to the Cross had promised them a life of safety and comfort? Christ offered his disciples the most dangerous and difficult task in the world.

Therein lies the appeal of the Cross. Someone said, "The most fascinating thing about Christianity has always been the Cross. Why? Because in the long run people do not respect a cheap and easy religion. They respect a commanding and challenging religion that will take all we can give and then call for more."

It challenges us at the point of our vocations - not only to full-time ministry in the church but to the choice of a career that will advance the gospel, regardless of what it costs us. The Cross challenges us at the point of our lifestyle - to live loving, caring, giving lives in this age of affluence and self-indulgence. The Cross challenges us at the point of our total commitment to Christ-the commitment of our time, energies, money, and reputation, all that we have and all that we are, for the work of his kingdom.

Fulfillment


We can say that sacrifice is not outmoded as long as it is a way to personal fulfillment. That's what Jesus taught his disciples. After calling them to take up their cross and follow him he said, "For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will find it."

Jesus never pretended that we can find life in any other way than by losing it. He left no doubt that only a life with the Cross at its heart and center can be radiantly and vitally Christian. Only a life controlled by his principle of sacrificial love can be a part of that larger life that he carried unbroken through death into eternity.

Redemption

Sacrifice is not outmoded as long as it is still a way of redemption. We know that once it was a way of redemption. We know that the world's salvation and our salvation were accomplished when Christ on the

Cross cried out with his dying breath, "It is finished." We agree with the German philosopher Hegel, by no means a convinced Christian, who said in his Philosophy of History, "We may affirm absolutely that nothing great in this world has ever been accomplished without passion." A church that would be a saving force for Christ in society must live precisely under the sign of the Cross. The kingdom of God must still enter the world by way of crucifixion.

GUIDELINES FOR OUR FAITHFUL, GUESTS, AND FRIENDS

CHURCH MEMBERSHIP: Membership at Saint Josaphat Ukrainian Catholic Church benefits **YOU** as it enables you to participate in stewardship of your church and enjoy a fuller spiritual life. To join as a registered member, email or telephone the Rectory Office .

THE MYSTERIES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION (BAPTISM, CONFIRMATION, HOLY EUCHARIST): Those who wish their children to receive the Mysteries of Christian Initiation must contact Saint Josaphat Rectory Office at least 6 weeks in advance of the desired Baptismal date; at least one parent must be an active registered parishioner of Saint Josaphat Church when requesting this Sacrament. Sponsors (Godparents) must provide a letter of suitability from the pastor of the Catholic Church they attend if they are not registered members this parish. Non-baptized adults who wish to be received into the faith should contact Saint Josaphat Rectory Office.

THE MYSTERY OF CONFESSION: Confessions are offered to all the faithful approximately 1 hour before each scheduled Divine Service, or you may make an appointment with Father Paul (or Father Andrii at Holy Ghost, West Easton) at any time.

THE MYSTERY OF THE MOST HOLY EUCHARIST: The reception of the Most Holy Eucharist is reserved only for Baptized Catholic Christians whose consciences are free from mortal sin.

THE MYSTERY OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK can be administered anytime there is a case of serious illness, injury, or disease. Please do not wait until your loved one is in danger of death!

THE MYSTERY OF MATRIMONY: Couples who wish to marry at should contact the Rectory Office at least 6 months in advance of the desired wedding date (or as soon as they are engaged).

FUNERALS: Active parish membership and participation is mandatory if an ecclesiastical funeral within the Church is desired; otherwise, the funeral service will be conducted at the funeral home or the home of the deceased **(IMPORTANT—this rule does not apply to those who are sick, shut-in, or are actively supporting the parish and are registered but have moved out of the area).** In-church viewings and cremations are strongly discouraged. 
