

PARISH ANNOUNCEMENTS:


1. The Week from Sunday, May 28th, through Sunday, June 4th, is a fast-free week; all faithful may partake of all animal food products even on Friday during this week. Also note, at sundown on Sun-

day, June 4th, the Apostle's Fast/Petrivka begins; the fasting rules of the Archeparchy of Philadelphia apply for all faithful who are able to participate in this fast.

- 2. Father Paul will be away from Monday, June 5th, 2023, through Friday, June 16th, 2023. Weekend Divine Liturgies will be celebrated as normal by Father Roman Dubitsky and Deacon Paul Makar. During this time, St. Josaphat's Rectory will be closed until Father Paul's return. If there is a pastoral emergency requiring a priest, please telephone Father Ed Higgins at Sts. GUIDELINES FOR OUR FAITHFUL, GUESTS, AND FRIENDS

CHURCH MEMBERSHIP: Membership at St. Josaphat Ukrainian Catholic Church benefits **YOU** as it enables you to participate in stewardship of your church and enjoy a fuller spiritual life. To join St. Josaphat's Church as a registered member, email or telephone Father Paul at St Josaphat's Rectory (contact information is listed on the cover of the bulletin).

THE MYSTERIES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION (BAPTISM, CONFIRMATION, HOLY EUCHARIST): Those who wish their children to receive the Mysteries of Christian Initiation must contact St. Josaphat Rectory at least 6 weeks in advance of the desired Baptismal date; at least one parent must be an active registered parishioner of St. Josaphat's Church when requesting this Sacrament. Sponsors (Godparents) must provide a letter of suitability from the pastor of the Catholic Church they attend if they are not registered members this parish. Non-baptized adults who wish to be received into the faith should contact Father Paul to arrange for receiving Catechetical instruction in preparation to receive the Mysteries of Christian Initiation.

THE MYSTERY OF CONFESSION: Confessions are offered to all the faithful 1/2 hour before each scheduled Divine Service, or you may make an appointment with Father Paul at any time.

THE MYSTERY OF THE MOST HOLY EUCHARIST: The reception of the Most Holy Eucharist is reserved only for Baptized Catholic Christians whose consciences are free from mortal sin. If you are not Catholic, or if you have not made a Confession and are bound by mortal sin, you may come ask for a blessing from Father.

THE MYSTERY OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK can be administered anytime there is a case of serious illness, injury, or disease. Contact Father Paul at any time to arrange for the reception of this Sacrament. Please do not wait until your loved one is in danger of death!

THE MYSTERY OF MATRIMONY: Couples who wish to marry at St. Josaphat Church should contact the Rectory Office at least 6 months in advance of the desired wedding date (or as soon as they are engaged).

FUNERALS: Active parish membership and participation is mandatory if one desires an ecclesiastical funeral within the Church; otherwise, the funeral service will be conducted at the funeral home or the home of the deceased.

Viewings in the Church are discouraged as this is traditionally reserved for consecrated monastics or clerics. If an in-church viewing is desired, a separate facility use fee will be assessed by St. Josaphat Church equivalent to the prevailing funeral home facility rates in the Lehigh Valley.

Also, the Church teaches us to avoid cremation (except only for dire circumstances) due to the sanctity and holiness of the human body that was created in the image and likeness of God If a cremation is insisted on, the family of the decedent must schedule the funeral service before cremation takes place if an ecclesiastical funeral is desired.

17 Worldly Consolations That Decrease My Faith

When I'm tired, irritated, sick, or merely experiencing a lull in the day, I can choose to console myself in one of two ways: through a worldly comfort or by lifting up my eyes to God with prayer, religious reading, or divine contemplation. Lamentably, I usually look to the world to give my flesh instant relief. Here is a list of consolations I currently use or have used to feel better in the moment, all of which competes with my love for God.

- 1. Eating tasty food past the point of satiety;
- 2. Reaching for my smartphone to check for unimportant new messages or news;
- 3. Prolonged staring at beautiful women;
- 4. Seeking direct praise when sharing my opinions, stories, or ideas;

5. Oversleeping, taking gratuitous naps, or using an alarm clock's snooze function beyond what is reasonable;

6. Consuming secular music or films to "unwind," not worry about life, and forget about death;

7. Taking unnecessarily long showers in hot water;

8. Consuming a socially acceptable drug (e.g., caffeine, alcohol) to create a desirable mental or physical state;

9. Craving nonstop laughter and fun during social conversation;

- 10. Seeking novelty through travel;
- 11. Gaining useless secular knowledge to feel more knowledgeable;

12. Improving my physical appearance for the main purpose of looking better than other men;

13. Complaining and grumbling (usually about other people);

14. Using modern medicine and supplements to alleviate the fear, anxiety, and physical pain of common illnesses;

15. Turning on the air conditioning when it's not that hot;

16. Indulging in fantasies where I am a hero or saint; and,

17. Responding with anger upon an insult or false accusation.

At the end of each item on the list above, add "because it feels good" for the reason I do it. Sadly, my body seems not to care about the next life, and only wants to be coddled and pleased in the here and now. I prefer immediate rewards that I know yield comfort or pleasure than wait for God to console me on His timeline according to His will. His consolation requires patience and is dispensed according to whether it will benefit the soul while worldly consolation only cares about the body without taking into account salvation.

Worldly consolation is fleeting, forms addictions, and leads to worship of false idols while divine consolation is sweet, joyful, and makes us become more in the likeness of God. If you are persistently consoling yourself with entertainment, food, and all other manner of pleasure, why then does God need to console you? Why does he need to fill you with His divine grace?

I do not judge you if you participate in behaviors that I've determined are unhealthy for me. You can do your own self-examination to see what is competing with your love for God. I've noticed that some men, for example, can speak to a beautiful woman without the risk of falling into lust like myself, but nonetheless our Lord does call us to a life of self-denial, so if you're filling your day with things that feel good, and none of those activities give you an opportunity to glorify God, you may want to ask yourself if you seek the temporal bosom of the world or the eternal bosom of God.

There are four fasting periods as well as four fast-free periods where fasting is not allowed. The four fasting seasons are:

- 1. The Great Fast/Lent (from the Sunday of Forgiveness/Cheesefare to Lazarus Saturday and Holy Week).
- 2. The Apostle's Fast (from the Sunday of All-Saints to the Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul on June 29th)
- 3. The Dormition Fast (Aug. 1st-14th)
- 4. Philip's/Nativity Fast (Nov. 15th through Christmas Eve, Dec. 24th).

The four fast-free seasons/weeks are:

PENTECOST SUNDAY

Today, we think about the coming of the Holy Spirit into the life of the early church. Besides the coming of the Spirit with mighty signs and wonders, there is a much gentler coming of the Spirit to our hearts. This is the experience of the comforting presence of God's love abiding by our side each and every day. It is the assurance that God has not abandoned us. It is the nudge in the hearts of God's sons and daughters that leads us back to Him. This is the coming of the Comforter into our lives. And it is this Spirit which is called Comforter who bids us to listen with our hearts. As Jesus says, "The Comforter will testify of me."

In turning our hearts to Jesus in this moment we hang onto the message He speaks. Jesus tells his followers that there will soon come a time when they will inevitably meet persecution because they follow him. There was a time when the disciples had Jesus present with them to protect them. But they would not always have Jesus with them and so he is beginning to prepare them for the realities which they will soon face. This is a message for us. Because we do not have the luxury of seeing Jesus eye to eye, we must abide in His presence which comes to us by way of the Holy Spirit.


In being reminded that we God is truly with us, we are also reminded that there is a certain sadness in the fact that we do not have Jesus physically with us. We are no different than the disciples of old. We yearn and desire to behold Him with our eyes and touch him with our hands. Instead we are left with the promise that Jesus will be with us. We are given the assurance of the Spirit bearing witness to Him as He speaks to our hearts.

Jesus reminds us that he must be at home with God. But the promise is sure and holds true that we are not left all alone to fend for ourselves in this world. We are given the Comforter in the midst of our tears and yearning which assures us that Jesus is risen and lives in our hearts.

It is with this experience of assurance that we hear a difficult word from Jesus himself. He says to us in essence, "I am telling you the truth. You will be better off if I leave you." How can this be the case? Only if Jesus leaves us in God's loving hands can we begin to choose to be open to the Spirit's leading us into the truth about God. It is only in the absence of Jesus that we can truly begin to trust in him. Remember that very shortly Jesus will say to another of his bewildered, wondering, wounded, and sad disciples over his departure, "Blessed are those who believe and do not see."

Jesus' absence makes clear the issue of our belief in Jesus. Thus, it is only when Jesus is absent that the test of faith can play itself out in us. Jesus says plainly that the Spirit of God will convict people because they are "wrong about sin." In John's Gospel the reality of sin can be focused sharply in the refusal of people to place their trust in Jesus. If people refuse to trust Jesus whom they cannot see then they remain in their sin.

God sends the Spirit to bear witness to the gospel truth about Jesus so people might believe while not being able to have the presence of Jesus physically with them. This is surely gospel, for if we could hold Jesus with us physically then he would surely die like all the rest of us, and the promise of new life found in him would also fade away. But Jesus has been raised and lives in God's love. That same love is shed abroad in our hearts through the Holy Spirit. That is why the judgment of the world about wanting to keep Jesus with us to hold has been already judged and, indeed, overcome by the Comforter. Thanks be to God.



Pentecost

Luke says that the Spirit came down on the disciples at Pentecost, after the Lord's ascension, with power to open the gates of life to all nations and to make known to them the new covenant. So it was that men of every language joined in singing one song of praise to God, and scattered tribes, restored to unity by the Spirit, were offered to the Father as the first fruits of all the nations.

The Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and strength, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of God came down upon the Lord, and the Lord in turn gave this Spirit to his Church, sending the Advocate from heaven into all the world into which, according to his own words, the devil too had been cast down like lightning. If we are not to be scorched and made unfruitful, we need the dew of God. Since we have our accuser, we need an Advocate as well. And so the Lord in his pity for mankind, who had fallen into the hands of brigands, having himself bound up his wounds and left for his care coins bearing the royal image, entrusted him to the Holy Spirit. Now, through the Spirit, the image and inscription of the Father and the Son have been given to us, and it is our duty to use the coin committed to our charge and make it yield a rich profit for the Lord.
